Youth Lead Now! is an initiative of The Aspen Institute that brings expert, national speakers into the living rooms of youth and families. These virtual monthly events provide an opportunity to build protective factors necessary for resilience while also motivating youth to stay engaged with community action. The ability to leverage the Institute's network – in service of our young leaders and local communities – could be one of the strongest symbolic messages of hope that we can provide when it is needed the most.

Youth Lead Now! is structured as a monthly, virtual townhall. Each session will feature a notable, national leader around a specific leadership theme with the underlying goal of building resilience, leadership efficacy, and agency.

Every session of Youth Lead Now! will address these fundamental questions:

- 1. Why are youth essential for community-driven leadership?
- 2. What is needed from youth leaders in the current crisis?
